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What is SEND? A pupil has Special Educational Needs and/or a Disability (SEND) if they have a learning difficulty or disability which calls for special educational provision to be made for them.

Last Term I carried out a pupil survey and it was great to hear how much our children with SEND like their teachers and enjoy school. They told me how safe they feel and that they are listened to.
