In remembrance of **Jane Hillyer**, who was a Governor at Kenningtons, we will be holding a non-School Uniform Day.








MODAL CODS

SALS SHOES There are 300 million barefoot children worldwide. 58 million children worldwide are not in school. 29 million of these are because they do not have the means. In many countries you cannot go to school without a pair of shoes.





WHY SHOES?

In lots of countries the education system is free to access but school uniform is mandatory.

If a child can't afford a pair of shoes, they can't go to school.

We thought how different that is from the UK where many children start each school year with a new pair of shoes and realised something important.

Lots of shoes get outgrown, not outworn.

What if those soon-to-be outgrown shoes got donated instead of thrown away at the end of the summer term, so we could find them new pairs of feet?

So at the end of the 2016 academic year we launched our very first Toe to Toe initiative in collaboration with The Hayes Primary School, with pupils placing their shoes on their desks at the end of the last day and leaving the school barefoot.
