The Health Spot - NHS Guidelines for 5 to 18 year-olds

According to NHS Guidance (http://www.nhs.uk/Livewell/fitness/Pages/physical-activity-guidelines-for-young-people.aspx) to maintain a basic level of health, children and young people aged 5 to 18 need to do:

- at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day this should range from moderate activity, such as cycling and playground activities, to vigorous activity, such as running and tennis
- on three days a week, these activities should involve <u>exercises for strong</u> <u>muscles</u>, such as push-ups, and <u>exercises for strong bones</u>, such as jumping and running

Many vigorous activities can help build strong muscles and bones, including running and jumping, gymnastics, martial arts and football.

Getting out and about in Autumn

The weather is changing, and so are the plants and animals that we can encounter on Autumn walks. The Woodland Trust (www.woodlandtrust.org.uk) has lots of outdoor activity challenges (like the Leaf ID sheet here) which can be used to entertain children (and grown-ups!) on walks.

We can use the leaves and seeds that fall from the trees (Kennington Park, Belhus Woods, Davey Down e.t.c) for games. For example, challenge children to collect as many different colour leaves as possible or use sticks, conkers and acorns to play an outdoor game of tic tack toe/noughts and crosses.
