Parents of current Year 2 pupils are advised that they will need to pay for school dinners when their child enters Year 3 unless the family is in receipt of **benefits based** free school meals.






The Battle of the Elements! Friday 13th July 2018

School Uniform

A quick reminder for parents that for both Girls and Boys the standard school uniform is a **white** shirt/blouse or polo-shirt or school logo polo shirt, **grey** bottoms (skirt, trousers, shorts), **navy blue** jumper/cardigan or school logo sweatshirt and **plain black** shoes (no trainers or boots). **White socks** or **grey tights** may be worn.

School uniform may be purchased online (for free deliver to Kenningtons) from http://www.sues-schoolwear.co.uk/

In summer term children are allowed to wear black or white sandals, but they must be worn with socks. Navy blue and white summer dresses are permitted in summer.

The expectation is that pupils will wear **plain** shirts, jumpers, etc. if they are not wearing the school logo.

The P.E. kit is a plain white top, plain black shorts and black plimsolls. P.E. kit should be kept in a drawstring bag.

Head Lice Alert!

Please check your child's hair carefully with a comb. A fine tooth comb is best. Wash hair in normal way, use lots of hair conditioner and comb from the roots. This should be done over a paper towel or bath. Wet lice find it difficult to escape and hair slippery with conditioner makes it hard for them to grip. This treatment requires a commitment to persevere but you may find it preferable to using chemicals.

Before using chemicals check with the Chemist or GP which preparation they recommend.

Preventing Head Lice

Look out for symptoms of head lice. Perform weekly checks, to look for nits and head lice in your child's hair. Keep long hair in a plait or ponytail. Avoid sharing combs, brushes, hair accessories, caps or hats.
