To solve this problem and stop so many bottles ending up in rubbish and hurting sea animals, you could buy a **re-useable water bottle**.

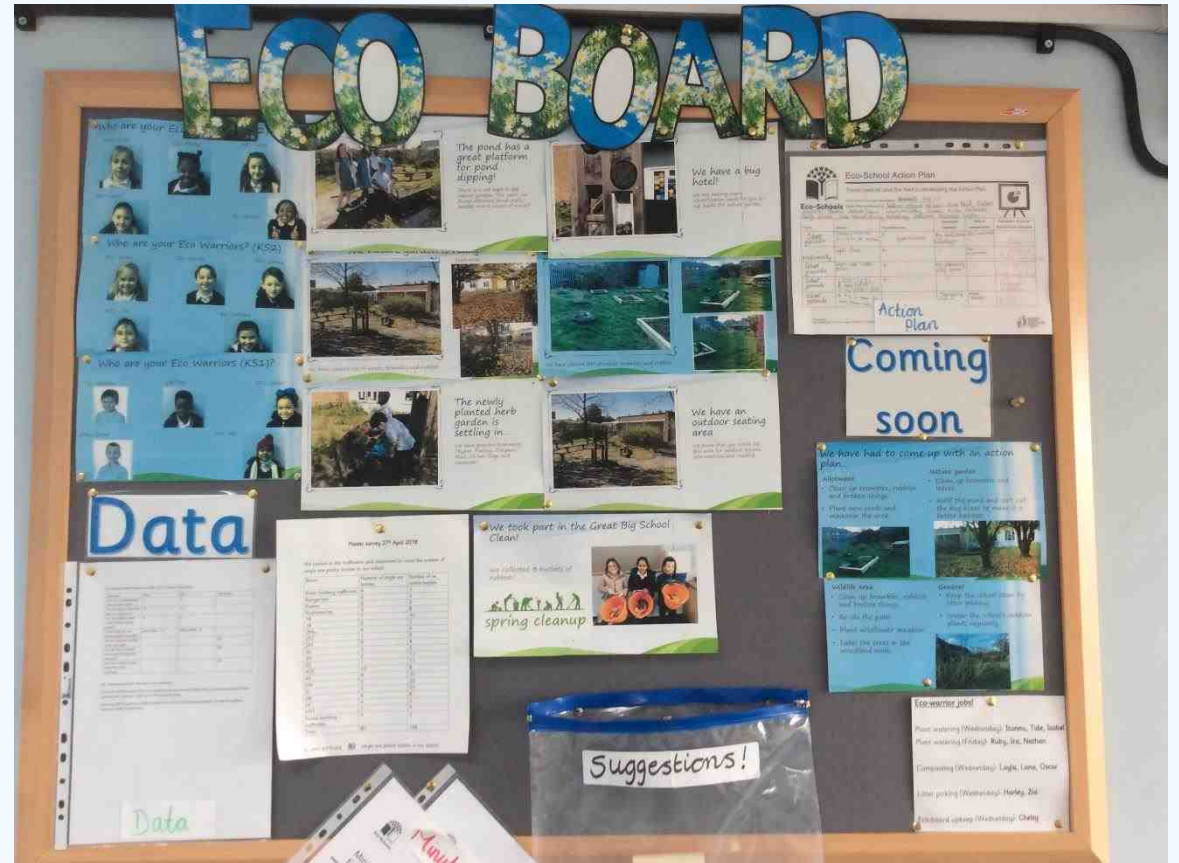



No more single-use plastic!
