Headlice Alert!

Please check your child's hair carefully with a comb.

A fine tooth comb is best.

Wash hair in normal way, use lots of hair conditioner and comb from the roots. This should be done over a paper towel or bath. Wet lice find it difficult to escape and hair slippery with conditioner makes it hard for them to grip.

This treatment requires a commitment to persevere but you may find it preferable to using chemicals.


Before using chemicals check with the Chemist or GP which preparation they recommend.

Preventing head lice

Look out for symptoms of head lice.

Perform weekly checks, to look for nits and head lice in your child's hair.

Keep long hair in a plait or ponytail. Avoid sharing combs, brushes, hair accessories, caps or hats. Notify your child's school and parents of your child's friends.

They also learnt that drinking plain water is like giving their teeth a shower, and should happen as much as possible.


It is hoped that they will make informed choices, and limit the amount of sugar they consume every day.
