

#### Apply for a primary school place

When making an application you can list up to four schools that you wish to apply for, in your order of preference. You can list schools outside of Thurrock, if you wish.

u are applying to any school that is religious by character, make sure you also complete their olementary form and return it direct to the school by the closing date for applications. If you have more than one child transferring to primary school, you must apply separately for each child needing a place.

ou do not complete the application and return it by the closing date of **15 January 2023**, you be given a place at the nearest school with a space available, after all on-time applications e been dealt with.
