# **Kenningtons Primary Academy**

It certainly feels like Christmas is approaching. It was very exciting in assembly today, as I was talking to the pupils about the Secret Santa, snowflakes began falling from the sky! A very Christmassy scene indeed.

As always at Kenningtons, the weeks are busy, busy with lots of interesting things happening.

Since I wrote to you last, we have had a Safeguarding audit from an External Consultant. The consultant spent time with Tracey, our Pastoral Manager and I, looking at our processes and policies. She wanted to ensure that these were in place and so also spent time talking to staff and pupils. I am still awaiting the final report, but I am pleased to tell you that it was a very positive day. As always, the pupils were a credit to our school. What came through very strongly on the day was our child centred approach and a very clear outcome that pupils are very safe and cared for at Kenningtons. The final report will be shared with our Governing Body for further scrutiny.

Mrs Clarke and I, along with the teachers have been looking carefully at pupils' books – we call this Book Scrutiny. We have looked carefully at English, Maths, History and Geography books, alongside pupils' Art Portfolios. This allows us to check that our vision for each subject is being taught correctly, and therefore that children are acquiring the skills and knowledge that they should. We saw many positives in the books, and any elements that were not as excellent as we would like, are being followed up. The quality of work in the books was very impressive. We are very proud of the quality of learning in our school.

This week, during staff INSET, our teachers visited other schools to share the pupils' writing books during a moderation session. Staff felt very confident sharing their books and the feedback was very positive. It is good practice for us to look outside of our own school, both to share our expertise and also to gain from others.

It is always a joy to see our pupils out and about and seeing 'The Kenningtons Experience' in action. The following trips/visitors have taken place:

- Reception have been to the local library, had a trip on a 'naughty' bus and had visits from the Air Ambulance and the Police.
- Year 1 have been on a Geography Field Trip in the Local Area.
- Year 2 have visited the Cinema at Lakeside, taken part in an African Drumming workshop and been on a trip to Paradise Wildlife Park.
- Year 3 have had a visitor from the Royal Opera House in preparation for their visit to
  the Nutcracker next week and also a visit from a local expert to learn about the Aveley
  Wooley Mammoth. They have also been to Chelmsford Museum to develop their
  learning about the Stone, Iron and Bronze Ages.
- Year 4 have been to the Cinema at Lakeside, to Rainham Marshes and to London to the British Museum. They have also taken part in Bikabilty (their life skill for this year).
- Year 5 have taken part in a Viking Workshop and been to the Walk Online Roadshow.
- Year 6 have had a WW2 Workshop in school.

In addition, Mrs Harris has taken various groups of pupils to many sporting events ensuring that our pupils have opportunities to experience success.

It has been lovely to be able to chat to parents at the Coffee sessions I have held. There will be more coming ...... so watch this space!
