Welcome back to a new term. I hope you all had a restful break and enjoyed spending time with family and friends.

On Monday, we welcomed a visitor from an educational consultancy. They spent the day with Mrs Clarke and myself looking closely at the new Ofsted Framework. Although inspection is a long way off, it is important that we stay up to date and continue to ensure that our pupils are receiving the very best education. The visit gave us confidence that, with just a few small tweaks — particularly in how we present information to inspectors — Kenningtons continues to achieve the highest standards.

One of the ways we demonstrate these high standards is through careful review of pupils' books alongside teachers' planning. Last week, we held a maths scrutiny, focusing on the prior learning checks that pupils complete. I was incredibly impressed by the depth with which teachers could talk about individual pupils, and the books themselves told a very positive and compelling story. As is always the case at Kenningtons, we identified the tiniest of tweaks to make things even better.

Trips and experiences continue to play an important role in enriching our curriculum. Year 6 have begun their self-defence classes, supporting their preparation for transition to secondary school and helping to build confidence and resilience. Year 3 recently visited the National Gallery and the Coliseum to watch *The Nutcracker*. I was fortunate to attend this trip and was extremely impressed by the pupils' behaviour. It was a real pleasure to see how much they enjoyed this wonderful experience and how proudly they represented Kenningtons.

I would also like to remind families that if your child has a secondary school-aged sibling who collects them from school, please speak to them about appropriate behaviour on our playground. Unfortunately, a small number of older pupils have behaved inappropriately and are therefore no longer permitted to enter the school site. Your support in reinforcing expectations will help ensure a safe and positive environment for everyone.




## Employees of the Week

# Merit Awards

The merit system has been designed to encourage, reward and promote exemplary work and good behaviour. It has also been designed to give recognition to pupils who make a positive contribution to the school that may otherwise go unnoticed. Not only do the merits reward hard work and effort, they also aim to recognise the pupils who are making positive steps to become model citizens in the future.

Number of Merits required to achieve each level:

**Bronze** = 50 merits (bronze certificate and bronze badge)

**Silver** = 60 merits (silver certificate and silver badge)

**Gold** = 75 merits (gold certificate, gold badge and a special trip reward)
