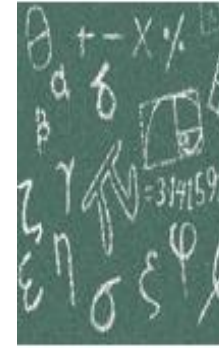

Maths



In Maths this half-term, the children will be learning how to tell the time on an analogue clock: O'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to and time in 5 minute intervals. They will also be studying 2D and 3D shapes and their properties and directions, positions and measurements.
