English



In English this half-term, the children will be studying the text the Stone Age Boy. They will look at the various language features and practise using these skills. We will be looking at skills such as fronted adverbials, direct speech and description.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's English: Talk about adjectives (describing words) and think of interesting ones to describe nouns. Instead of using common ones think of alternatives for example instead of 'big' use enormous.

Science



Our science topic for this half-term is plants. As always, the children will develop their scientific enquiry skills by working practically to explore the parts of a plant and the pollination process.

Maths



In Maths this half-term, the children will be looking at place value up to 1000. The children will explore this by part whole models and pictorial representations. They will learn how about addition. We will be using mental and formal methods.

Suggestions of ways you can support your child's Maths: Please encourage your child to go on Times Table Rock Stars. This year they will need to be confident with the 2,3,4,5,8 & 10 times tables.

History



Our topic for this half-term is the Three Ages. We will begin by learning about life in the Stone Age before moving on to the Bronze Age and Iron Age. We will be looking at artefacts and different sources. The children will be analysing these to learn about the different ways of life.

Extra Information

PE: Our PE days are Thursday & Friday. Please ensure children are wearing correct PE kit and no jewellery on these days (earrings can be taped up at home if needed).

Merits: In Year 3, the week for merits will run Thursday to Thursday. The spelling test and maths test for Year 3 will be conducted on a Thursday and this is when adults will stamp the learning logs.



Spellings for the spelling test will be glued into the Learning Log by Friday so that they can be practised for the spelling test on the following Thursday.

We would like to inform you of some changes to our school's merit system for this year. These updates are designed to encourage and reward children for their continued effort and progress in reading, spelling, and maths.

Reading Merits

- 1 merit will be awarded if your child reads at least 4 times in a week.
- Each daily entry must include a comment and signature from an adult to acknowledge the reading, otherwise merits may not be awarded.
- Please ensure that your child is reading for 15 minutes; stamps may not be awarded if only a small number of pages are read, particularly for pupils in Key Stage 2.

Homework Merits

Spelling:

- 1 merit will be awarded for a score of 8 or more in the weekly spelling test. The diaries have been amended this year so that scores will be sent home weekly.
- In Reception, children can earn 1 merit per week for completing all of the English Superstar challenges.

Maths:

- 1 merit will be awarded for a score of 8 or more in the weekly maths test.
- In Years 5 and 6, the merit will instead be awarded for successful completion of all the daily Quick 5s in that week
- In Reception, 1 merit will be awarded per week for completing all Maths Superstar challenges

It is vital that your child's learning record is in school every day so that merits can captured as they are awarded. For more details of how merits are achieved, please see page 2 of your child's learning record.

In Year 3, the week for merits will run Thursday to Thursday.
