

## English



The children will write a monologue as one of the characters from the Greatest Showman. Following this, they will write two speeches: one from a rich person's viewpoint, who want the circus closed down; and the other from a poor person's viewpoint, who want the circus to stay.

**Suggestions of ways you can support your child's English:** Encourage your child to read at least 4 times per week. This must be with a leveled library book in order to collect merits for reading. Talk to the children about what they have read and question their understanding.

## Science



In Science, our topic is light and how we see. The children will investigate light in various ways: using lasers to see how light travels; creating periscopes; labelling an eye and how each part helps us see; watching the dissection of an eye; how shadows are formed; and refraction of light.
