- Give children the skills and knowledge to lead a healthy lifestyle



As Parents we will:

- Expect the best behaviour from our child, and accept the consequences if they do not behave

- Ensure your child has good (at least 96%) attendance
- Provide a healthy packed lunch or snacks
- Read all school communications and respond within appropriate timescales
- Share concerns we have through appropriate channels
